# ~Legislative Update~

SINE DIE! The Arizona 53<sup>rd</sup> Legislature has adjourned for 2017. However, your EANGA Legislative Committee has not. Committee Chair Dean Miller is in contact with legislative offices to find out why the bills EANGA was supporting failed. As of May 26th, here is an update on the following bills:

HB 2297, National Guard; Readiness Center; Appropriation: This bill would have appropriated monies to build a new readiness center at the Valencia Armory in Tucson. It had passed the House, but failed in Senate Appropriations, 5-5-0. According to the Arizona Legislature RTS, this bill met heavy resistance from many people who were tied to the Arizona Charter Schools Association and the Arizona Association of Counties.

HB 2352, National Guard; Reduced Tuition Rate: This bill would have allowed eligible Arizona National Guard members to attend any public state institution at the same tuition rate as an employee of that institution. It passed easily in committee, but failed on the House floor, 23-35-2. According to the Arizona Legislature RTS, this bill met resistance from the Board of Regents and the three largest state universities.

HB 2433, Income Tax Subtraction: Veterans' Pensions: EANGA submitted a resolution for this bill through Representative Todd Clodfelter. If passed, this bill would have increased the military pension state tax exemption from the current \$2500 to \$5000. It

passed the House easily; however, the Senate President asked that it be heard first in the Finance Committee. Unfortunately, that committee chair did not allow it to be heard. There was absolutely no resistance to this bill from outside sources.

Though these bills are done, your EANGA Legislative Committee is not and we will be discussing ways to submit these resolutions again for the next Arizona legislative session. Your EANGA Legislative Committee continues to work hard on issues that effect our Arizona National Guard Soldiers, Airmen, Retirees and their families, but we cannot do this alone. We need your help to make our mission a success. Protect your jobs, protect your benefits, and protect yourselves by joining us to ensure our Army remains strong and that our Air Force continues to fly in the Arizona National Guard.

### ~2017 EANGUS National Conference~

The 2017 EANGUS National Conference will be held in the "biggest little city in the world", Reno, NV from August 27-30, 2017.

In addition to the EANGUS business sessions, NGB has once again approved a Professional Development program for Soldiers and Airmen E6 and below; the State CSM and CCM will select those attendees who get to attend the conference on paid military orders.

There is also a conference registration fee which gets you into the business session, exhibitor expo. all evening events, and the formal banquet dinner to close the conference on Wednesday evening. The current registration price is \$150, however, this price will be rising to \$200 on July 1st.

The Welcome Night event will be held at the National Bowling Stadium, and the All State Hospitality Night is at Rancho San Rafael Park. Other conference activities include a golf outing on August 25th. which is an additional cost.


