EANGA President's Message:

Once again, it's been a busy several months for EANGA as we continue to work on your behalf. In August, we met at the State Capital with State Representative Richard Andrade and representatives from ASU, NAU and Maricopa County Community College District to discuss possible legislation for tuition assistance for members of the Arizona National Guard. Unfortunately, the colleges and universities are unwilling to support any legislation that would detract from their funding or finances, to include allowing our National Guard members to fill otherwise vacant classroom seats. As a result, we will have to pursue other avenues to provide and fund some form of tuition assistance program. Representative Andrade is very supportive of the Arizona National Guard and has agreed to help EANGA write up a legislative proposal to address this.

The EANGUS National Conference was held in Reno, NV, 27-30 August, 2017. Arizona was well represented with 16 in attendance, and I can report that it was a great success; see the report on page 3 for more information. I would also like to congratulate CSM-R Karen Craig for her work as the editor of our newsletter, The Desert Chronicle, which was awarded 1st Place in the noncommercial publications category during the National Conference.

We also have several activities coming up in January and I would encourage your participation. First, on Thursday, January 18th at 5:30pm, we will hold our annual Membership Appreciation Night at the 161st Wing Dining Facility. We invite you to join us for pizza/beverages -- this event is for you, our members, so we hope you will drop by.

Secondly, EANGA will be participating in the Maricopa County StandDown for Homeless Veterans as a community service activity. The StandDown will be conducted at the Veterans Memorial Coliseum at the State Fairgrounds in Phoenix on 25-26 January 2018. This event allows Veterans and their families who are experiencing housing instability and homelessness to get connected to the resources they need. EANGA will be participating in the Annual EANGUS Legislative Workshop, and making visits to our Arizona Congressional representatives 4-7 Feb 2018, Washington, DC. Stay tuned for our after action report! Your Enlisted Association has begun work on two legislative issues. They are tuition reimbursement and a new Readiness Center in Tucson.

As you may know, the current tuition assistance program that was passed by the Arizona Legislature in 2015 is not working for you. That may change. Recently, EANGA President Tom Matthew and Legislative Committee Chair Dean Miller met with Arizona Representative Richard Andrade and representatives from Arizona State University, Northern Arizona University, and several Arizona community colleges to discuss how to provide our Arizona National Guard members some form of tuition assistance or reimbursement without it being a burden on the state's budget and the colleges themselves. After an extensive and productive discussion, a new idea for a resolution was suggested. The resolution would focus on requesting funds from Arizona's "rainy day" fund on a yearly basis in

order to fund the current Arizona National Guard Tuition Reimbursement Program. The resolution is the first step, but if passed, the change would offer educational assistance to many of our Soldiers and Airmen who do not qualify for any type of GI bill benefits.

Last year, the Arizona National Guard Legislative Liaison, with the support of EANGA, tried to get a resolution passed to fund the construction of a new readiness center in Tucson. Unfortunately, the resolution died in committee. Another chance is at hand. Along with the AZNG Legislative Liaison, EANGA will be hosting a State Legislator's tour at the Valencia and Silverbell Armories in Tucson on November 30th and December 14th. During this tour, EANGA will have the opportunity to explain the need and show our State Legislators the crowded and outdated conditions that Arizona National Guard

Soldiers have to work in during drills and predeployment phases.

Once the resolutions for these two issues are released, EANGA will be contacting you to join us by calling, emailing, and writing to your legislators asking for his or her support. EANGA will also seek out fellow lobbying groups to get strength behind these very important issues. This is an opportunity for your voice to be heard.

In closing, are you savvy with legislative issues or just have a knack for dealing with legislation? If so, then you may be interested in being the Legislative Committee Chair. EANGA is looking for someone to take the lead on this committee due to Chair Miller's departure occurring after the 2018 State Conference. EANGUS National Conference Report

The 2017 National Conference is in the books and it was another great one! Hosted by the Nevada Enlisted Association, it was held at the Reno Event Center from August 27-30, 2017. Arizona was represented by 16 personnel to include delegates, EANGA members, spouses or significant others, and two Soldiers, SGT Joshua Vurro (WAATS) and SPC Stephen Munoz (1/158th Infantry and AZARNG Soldier of the Year) who attended the EANGUS Professional Development Program.

This year's conference and Professional Development Program attendees enjoyed several informative speakers. General Joseph Lengvel. Chief of the National Guard Bureau, (pictured on the right) spoke to over 900 enlisted personnel highlighting the evolution of the National Guard from a strategic reserve to an operational force and recognizing the 850.000 National Guard members who have deployed since 9/11. CSM Christopher Kepner, Army National Guard Command Sergeant Major, also spoke about the Guard's operational force during his remarks.

Attendees were also inspired by the remarks from COL (Retired) Edward Hubbard, former Prisoner of War. Colonel Hubbard shared his story of captivity in North Vietnam, and

spoke of the spirit of his fellow POWs and their belief in and devotion to the United States. If you want to learn more about his story, check out his book "Escape from the Box—The Wonder of Human Potential."

Much of the work of the Association is done during the annual conference and this year was no different as Area Caucus and EANGUS Committee meetings were conducted and reports given. The delegates voted to approve a complete revision to our Bylaws which have been in the works for the last two years, and also approved 17 resolutions. These resolutions will drive our legislative focus for the next year.
