EANGA / NGA AZ 2018 ANNUAL STATE CONFERENCE

CSM (Ret) Tom Matthew, EANGA President announces and invites all EANGA members and AZ Army & Air National Guard enlisted personnel to attend the Annual State Conference on April 27-28, 2018. Once again, the conference will be held jointly with the National Guard Association of Arizona (NGAAZ) at the Arizona Grand Resort, 8000 S. Arizona Grand Parkway, Phoenix. A registration form is attached on page 6, and the complete Conference Brochure can be viewed on our website at www.eanga.org. Personnel attending any of the paid events must submit your registration form NLT April 14th.

The conference fun begins on Friday, April 27th with a Golf Tournament at the resort starting with check-in at 11 am. The cost for the golf tournament is \$80 per person; details are included in the brochure. Paid conference attendees are also welcome to attend the opening reception on Friday evening.

The conference will continue on Saturday, April 28th at 8:00 am with a Professional Development (PD) program for all attendees (Officers & Enlisted). Units of the AZ Army and Air NG have been given a specific number of slots for military members who will be able to attend the PD program on a paid status; if you're interested in attending, contact your Unit First Sergeant or Commander.

The EANGA business meeting, which includes a free lunch, will start at 1230 hours. LEGISLATIVE NEWS!!

In local Arizona legislative news, we are encouraged by the news that Governor Doug Ducey's Executive Budget Recommendation included a request for the \$5M that is needed in State match funding for construction of the Southeast Arizona Readiness Center which would house the 222nd Transportation Company, AZ ARNG. The total state match requirement is \$6M, but DEMA has \$1M from the proceeds of the sale of the Roosevelt Armory to apply to the project thus lowering the needed state match to \$5M. Additionally, the Governor is requesting \$1M in funding to restart the National Guard Tuition Reimbursement Program.

These are both State Legislative funding items which EANGA has advocated for. As you may recall, EANGA has been working to re-instate the Tuition Reimbursement Program for several years, so getting them in the Governor's budget recommendation is a big step forward. At this time, negotiations on the Governor's budget continue, and we encourage you to reach out to your

State Legislators and ask them to express their support for the National Guard items in the Governor's Budget.

Typically, stand-alone bills are not necessary in order to get an initiative passed; however, there was a separate bill prepared by Representative Andrade that would have restored the National Guard Tuition Reimbursement program to the previous amount of \$1.446M per year. That bill, HB2475, still hasn't been heard in House Appropriations, but it did receive a Do Pass recommendation from the House Military, Veteran, and Regulatory Affairs Committee on February 13, 2018. We will keep you posted if we need any additional support on that bill or the Governor's budget recommendation.

Also, for your awareness, the Oregon State Legislature recently passed HB 4035 that would appropriate \$2.5M per year for tuition grants for the members of the Oregon National Guard. The bill is currently awaiting the Governor's signature, but if

it is signed as it is expected to be, it will leave Arizona as the only state without an education benefit.

The other bill that EANGA has been watching and supporting is SB 1167, Increased Income Tax Subtraction. The current Arizona tax deduction for military retirement is \$2500 per year. SB 1167 would increase that deduction to \$6,250 in 2019, and to \$10,000 in 2020. The bill passed the Arizona Senate and was transmitted to the Arizona House of Representatives on February 5, 2018. It is currently pending hearing by the House Ways and Means and House Rules Committees. 2018 EANGUS Legislative Workshop...

EANGA President CSM (Ret) Tom Matthew and CSM (Ret) Karen Craig attended the EANGUS Legislative Workshop in Washington DC in early February 2018. In addition to workshop meetings and the large variety of speakers, they also met with Congresswoman Kyrsten Sinema (AZ9), as well as staffers in the offices of Congressman Paul Gosar (AZ4) and Representative Martha McSally (AZ2).

One of the key topics discussed during these meetings was the proposed removal of the Apache Battalion from the Arizona Army National Guard. EANGA stands behind The Adjutant General, Maj General McGuire who has stated that the Army should halt any further divestment of Army attack aviation assets, and reinstate AH-64 training at the WAATS. The political landscape and threat environment have changed since the initial Aviation Restructure Initiative.

The Army should not make an irreversible decision regarding attack aviation that affects warfighter readiness and puts dismantled troops on the ground at risk. Considering world events, the nation cannot afford to divest high-demand attack aviation that takes years and billions of taxpayer dollars to regenerate. The active component (AC) is facing a critical attack aviation shortage: the AC has AH-64 aircraft without having soldiers to fly or maintain them, and the Guard has skilled pilots and crews ready for deployment but no aircraft. Any decision to retire or retrain currently trained Apache pilots and ground maintenance crew members in the Guard while the Army is experiencing a historic attack aviation shortage is a waste of taxpayer dollars. Furthermore, the AC cannot keep up with the demand for attack aviation training to support

Combatant Commander war-fighting requirements and must reactivate AH-64 training at the WAATS immediately. Keeping and deploying the 1-285th ARB, when needed, supports national defense priorities and attack aviation readiness.

Other discussions with our AZ elected representatives included the EANGUS Point Papers on Duty Status Reform & 10 USC 12304b Disparity, and Expansion of TRICARE Reserve Select coverage for federal technicians. EANGUS has published a Call to Action on both of these topics; see more details on page 3 and contact your representatives!

Answer the EANGUS Call to Action

Guard & Reserve Benefit Parity Act of 2018 - EANGUS CALL 2018-1

Recently, Senators Roger Wicker and Chris Coons introduced S. 2416 and Representatives Steven Palazzo and Tim Walz introduced H.R. 5038, the *Guard & Reserve Benefit Parity Act of 2018*. The legislation is a follow-up to last year's Parity Act. Fortunately, pieces of that legislation were incorporated into other legislative vehicles during the first session of Congress. Specifically, the pre- and post-mobilization healthcare coverage for those serving on 12304b orders and the Post-9/11 GI Bill benefits (retroactive) were signed into law in the Fiscal Year 2018 National Defense Authorization Act and Colmery Forever GI Bill respectively.

Background: 12304b mobilization authority was established in the 2012 NDAA to allow DOD to deploy reserve forces for preplanned missions in support of combatant commanders. However, 12304b created a benefit disparity among the components. Reserve forces are compelled to leave behind family, friends, careers, and education pursuits to provide life-saving humanitarian aid across the globe, as well as security forces and logistical support in the Sinai, Kosovo, Eastern Europe, and around the world. Unlike the active component, reserve forces are not provided pre- and post-mobilization TRICARE, Post-9/11 Montgomery GI Bill Benefits, or Reduction in retirement age credit for time spent deployed. Last year, EANGUS, NGAUS, and ROA were victorious in solving the pre- and post-mobilization TRICARE and Post-9/11 Montgomery GI Bill Benefits inequities. We ask that you contact your elected officials and ask them to become a co-sponsor of S.2416 and H.R. 5038 and support the bill should it come to the floor. If passed by Congress and signed by the President, the Guard and Reserve Benefit Parity Act would provide the following: Eligibility of RC members for non-reduction in pay; consideration of service on active duty to reduce the age of eligibility for retired pay for non-regular service; and eligibility of RC members for high-deployment allowance for lengthy or numerous deployments and frequent mobilizations.

TRICARE Reserve Select Expansion to Eligible Federal Employees - EANGUS CALL 2018-2

During the first session of the 115th Congress, Senator Hatch (R-UT) introduced S.1086 which aims to remove the prohibition on TRICARE eligibility for members of the Selected Reserve of a reserve component of the Armed Forces who are enrolled or eligible to enroll in the Federal Employee Health Benefits Program (FEHBP). In February, Representatives Kelly (R-MS) and Rosen (D-NV) introduced a companion bill, H.R. 5121.

Background: The EANGUS National Office staff have long advocated for eligible federal employees to gain access to TRS regardless of their employment status. During the 2017 and 2018 Legislation Workshops, EANGUS members stormed Capitol Hill to advocate for the expansion of this important benefit. We ask that you contact your elected officials in Washington, DC. And ask them to become a co-sponsor of H.R. 5121 and S.1086, and support the bill should it come to the floor. EANGA is pleased to announce our annual scholarship program which is open to AZ NG enlisted personnel and their spouse or dependent children who are or will be attending college in the fall of 2018. a. EANGUS CSM Virgil R. Williams Memorial Scholarship which **generally awards at least two, but up to ten - \$2,000** scholarships annually. For the first time, EANGUS will also offer a number of \$1,000 cash scholarships via the new Patriot's Scholarship. Winners will be announced during the EANGUS Conference in Charleston, WV in August 2018.

b. EANGA will offer two scholarships in 2018. The CMSGT Gerald R. Guild Memorial Scholarship will provide **one - \$1,000 scholarship**. Additionally, USAA funded the CSM Harry & Mary Hensel Scholarship which is a **\$1,000 scholarship**. Both of these Arizona scholarships will be awarded and presented during an appropriate ceremony on/ after April 28, 2018.
